

English 118 Practice MC Sections

Today, we're going to taking the next multiple-choice practice test on the computers in the library. Follow the directions below to load and log into the APCD program. **Don't forget: we are in the library and we need to be on our absolute best behavior!!!** If we misbehave, the remaining computer exams will have to be completed on your *own* time, for homework!

FOLLOW DIRECTIONS

To load the program:

- ❖ Go to the "Start" menu (lower left-hand corner of the screen)
- ❖ Click on the following links:
 - Programs: APCD
 - APCD English 12 (yes, English 12)

When you are prompted for your **log-in information**, enter the fields for "first name," "last name," "class name" and "password" (as shown below). Make sure that your information is typed in lowercase.

<i><u>Example:</u></i>
FIRST NAME: student
LAST NAME: 1 (<i>all students will have a different number</i>)
CLASS NAME: 118
PASSWORD: gatsby1 (<i>then insert the same number as you entered for last name</i>)

After you've logged in:

- ❖ Follow the links listed below:
 - Multiple Choice Practice
 - Instructional mode
 - Test B
 - You *may* be prompted with the following: "You've already taken this test. Do you want to clear your score?"
 - If so, click the "Yes" button.
 - **20th Century questions only**

❖ When you finish the test:

- Click the "Tally Marks" icon on the top of the screen
- When your score comes up, follow the links listed below:
 - File
 - Print
 - Click "O.K."
- Pick up your score print-out from the front counter of the library (free of charge!)
- Turn in your score to Mr. Levin

You will have today to complete the second part of Test B. You will also complete the attached chart as you answer questions. **THE CHART IS NOT OPTIONAL.** If you finish early, please go back and check your work. You will be given credit/no credit for this assignment: so, as long as you take the test and show your work on the chart, you will be given credit. This is an individual assignment.

When you have finished answering this section, PRINT YOUR SCORE, staple the printed results to your chart, and give it to Mr. Levin.
